COVID-secure studying at Jesus: key points for students not living in a college household

The College and the University have in place detailed protocols to support a COVID-secure living and working environment for students and staff. College information may be found in the Covid-19 section on our intranet. The following points encapsulate the key things that you need to know and do. If you observe them all then you will be helping to support appropriately a COVID-secure living and working environment.

Social distancing inside and outside your household

- when in College with people who are not members of your household, you
 must maintain two-metre social distancing at all times (at meals, in tutorials, in
 the Library, when socialising etc)
- you may mix freely with other members of your household, both within your household space and elsewhere, unless someone in your household is symptomatic (in which case, see below)
- if someone in your household is symptomatic, self-isolate while they wait for their test results
- When meeting with people not in your household, by law you may not meet indoors or outdoors in groups larger than six (formal academic activities are exempt)

When out and about in the College

- you must wear a face covering when in a college or university building, but you may remove it in order to eat in one of our dining areas
- you must follow signs and arrows indicating directions of travel around College
- where practical, meet other people outdoors or online
- wash / sanitise your hands frequently
- non-members may not be brought as guests to any indoor College site

Arrangements for meals

- the Hall, from where you may collect meals, will be open for longer than usual at mealtimes
- you will need to book a meal slot online
- social distancing will be in place in the queue and in dining areas
- you may eat in Hall or in the marquee

What happens if I show symptoms of Covid-19?

- If you are in your own room, in your own household, remain there
- If you are somewhere else, return to your own room, in your own household
- Book at test at the University's testing service
- You may leave your room in order to attend your appointment, but otherwise you should self-isolate until you receive your results
