

# COVID-19 PROTOCOLS FOR STUDENTS MT20

The College and the University have in place detailed protocols to support a COVID-secure living and working environment for students and staff. College information may be found in the <u>Covid-19 section on our intranet</u>. The following points encapsulate the key things that you need to know and do. If you observe them all then you will be helping to support appropriately a COVID-secure living and working environment.

- Students are required to sign and return their <u>Covid-19 Student Responsibility</u> <u>Agreement</u> and to abide by it.
- Students are strongly encouraged to download and install the College's <u>Callmy</u> text alert system. This enables the College to communicate quickly with College members via their mobile phone.
- Students are also strongly encouraged to download and install the official <u>NHS</u> <u>COVID-19 contact tracing app</u> for England and Wales

# Social distancing inside and outside your household

- When in College with people who are not members of your household, you must maintain two-metre social distancing at all times (at meals, in tutorials, in the Library, when socialising etc)
- You may mix freely with other members of your household, both within your household space and elsewhere, unless someone in your household is symptomatic (in which case, see below)
- If someone in your household is symptomatic, self-isolate while they wait for their test results
- You must remain distant from other households and cannot share facilities.

# When out and about in the College

- You must wear a <u>face covering</u> (unless exempt) when in a college or University building or setting, but you may remove it in order to eat in one of our dining areas
- Please be aware that some students have valid reasons not to wear a face mask

- If you are exempt from wearing a face covering you must inform the Academic Director (<u>alexandra.lumbers@jesus.ox.ac.uk</u>) so that your tutors and key staff can be informed
- Some students and staff use lip-reading or other visual cues, so they may ask you to remove your face covering when talking to them, please do respect this request. The College is sourcing masks with transparent panels for tutors and students to use in teaching settings where one of the group needs to lip read You must follow signs and arrows indicating directions of travel around College (one-way system with entry through Turl Street and exit through Ship Street)
- Where practical, meet other people outdoors or online
- Wash / sanitise your hands frequently
- Non-Jesus College members may not be brought as guests to any indoor College site or accommodation.
- You must comply with all reasonable questions from College staff, including the Junior Deans.

# Arrangements for meals

- The Hall, from where you may collect meals, will be open for longer than usual at mealtimes
- You will need to book a meal slot online
- Social distancing will be in place in the queue and in dining areas
- You may eat in Hall or in the marquee in second quad.

# Library

- Students are expected to abide by the bookable slots when working in the Library (see Library information at: <u>https://jesuscollegeintranet.web.ox.ac.uk/for-students</u>)
- Students are expected to abide by social distancing rules when in the Library.

# What happens if you show symptoms of Covid-19?

- Follow the <u>NHS guidelines on when and how to self-isolate</u>
- If you are in your own room, in your own household, remain there
- If you are somewhere else, return to your own room, in your own household
- <u>Book a test</u> at the University's testing service as soon as possible
- Alert the other members of your household as soon as possible as they will need to self-isolate until you get your results
- You may leave your room in order to attend your appointment, but otherwise you should self-isolate until you receive your results. You should return from your appointment as quickly as possible
- Please let us know that you have symptoms.
